**Bonnet House to Offer Admission Discounts During
Super Bowl XLIV**

February 1, 2010, Ft. Lauderdale, FL—Bonnet House Museum & Gardens welcomes fans of the Indianapolis Colts and New Orleans Saints to Fort Lauderdale for Super Bowl XLIV! Built in 1920, Bonnet House was the winter home of Frederic Clay Bartlett and his wife Evelyn Fortune Bartlett and is located on 35 acres of pristine barrier island habitat in the midst of Fort Lauderdale Beach. Both Frederic and Evelyn were accomplished artists, and the historic home has many of their decorative flourishes. The home also has ties to both Indianapolis and New Orleans. Evelyn Bartlett was an Indianapolis native and had been married to Eli Lilly, the pharmaceutical magnate and grandson of the founder of Eli Lilly and Company. Frederic Bartlett designed Bonnet House as his interpretation of a Caribbean plantation style home and included wrought iron metal work and decorative gates in his design that were made in New Orleans.

As a special welcome to Super Bowl fans, Bonnet House is offering a \$5 discount off normal admission prices from February 2nd through February 9th. To receive this discount, visitors should present an Indiana or Louisiana driver's license, a Super Bowl XLIV ticket, or NFL credentials. Members of the media will be admitted free of charge on presentation of valid credentials.

Bonnet House is open for public tours Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 10:00am to 4:00pm, Saturday from 10:00am to 3:30pm and from 10:00am to 6:00pm on Wednesday. Sunday hours are 11:00am to 4:00pm. Bonnet House is located near the intersection of Sunrise Boulevard and A1A at 900 N. Birch Road. Normal admission prices are \$20 for adults, \$18 for seniors, and \$16 for children ages 6-12; children under age six are free.
